

We are told that love and kindness unlock the true nature of life. Love and kindness were the true hallmark of Sr Margaret Mary. Her great delight was in doing a good turn for somebody. If she said she would do something, you could be sure it would be done.



Margaret Mary's life was a life of prayer, whether at work in the laundry or in the kitchen the aspirations flowed constantly. Truly for her 'laborare est orare'. To work is to pray. This was not to say that the orare was in any way neglected. Much of her spare time was spent with the Blessed Sacrament and her devotion to the Rosary and Our Lady was a constant. The Sacred Heart, too, was a great friend of hers.

It was with great delight that Margaret Mary took charge of the sacristy and chapel, preparing for Mass and Benediction. On the other hand her use of words was rich and rare. She had a wonderful way of calling a spade a spade. Once when one of her sisters remarked on how cold it was, she was promptly told by Margaret Mary that if she was working she wouldn't feel the cold!!

When sickness and the frailty of old age confined her to bed, she remained faithful to all the devotions especially Morning and Evening Prayer. She edified all of us by her prayer life, her resignation and her appreciation of the Carers who looked after her with such love and devotion.

Margaret Mary was a special gift our community, loved and cherished by all of us. She slipped away very quietly from us on Saturday afternoon. She will be greatly missed by all our community, the Carers and all her many friends and relations.

From the Homily by Fr. Ray Dempsey C.C. Ferrybank

"Sr Margaret Mary felt the call to religious life and approached Fr. Comerford who was one of the priests in Piltown at the time. Incidentally, Fr Comerford was an uncle of Sr Betty who of course is a member of the community here in Ferrybank. Fr Comerford directed her to the convent in Ferrybank and she entered as a late vocation in those days in her late 20's. In Ferrybank she spent all her religious life – caring for others, serving others. She was very much the friendly, hospitable face of the RSHM sisters here in Ferrybank. She was an institution in herself and had her own way of doing things, but nevertheless all was done with a generous and loving heart. Many of my colleagues in the Diocese who had served here in Ferrybank would often ask for her when I would meet them at meetings or gatherings in the Diocese. And indeed all of them spoke very highly of her. I'm sure she would have been thrilled – 3 priests on the day of her death."
