Foundation Day Celebration in Lisburn, February 2017

There was a short introduction on the foundation of the institute and the situation in Beziers in 1849.

In 1849 life was not much different, though perhaps on a different plane, when Father Gailhac gathered his little flock about him to face the reality of life in the city of Béziers.


Meeting of the Extended Family in Béziers, 24th February 2017
