Of the wonder of the mystic world all around me.

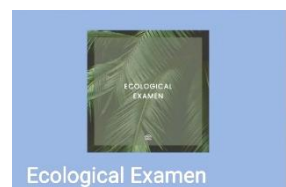


Ecological Examen

God bless each one of you, and bless our mission to rebuild our common home. Thank you."

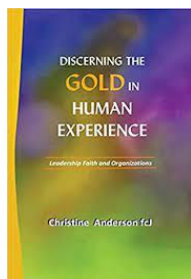

On Friday 17th September Sr Christine Anderson FCJ, trained in Organisational Analysis, published a book titled '**Discerning the Gold in human experience**'. In this book she talks about the process of integrating faith and life, living with reality and uncertainty, coping with faith and crisis, working on our inward journey. She also mentions a Systems Theory, emphasising that what holds our system together is our mission.

Yes, you've guessed, it uses the methodology of See, Judge and Act.
