BLIND BART'S LEAP


Mark 10:46-52, Matthew 20:29-34, Luke 18:35-40






In **A Creed for Today** rather than seeing ecological theology as an adjunct to Christian doctrine, Donal Dorr views it as central to our understanding of Catholicism today and integral to understanding our relationship with the natural world. Espousing what he dubs a ‘new earth awareness’, the author lays out a compelling vision for how we should live at both a spiritual and practical level in terms of our Christian faith and the attendant responsibility to care for our planet.

In **Returning Light** Robert Harris reflects on his 30 years as a warden on Skellig Michael - the site of an ancient monastery on a rock-like island off the Kerry coast. He transports readers to this very special world, one where puffins like to visit, and a coastline that was made even more famous by a certain film Star Wars film franchise. It is a reflection on his experience and can be seen as a contemplative prayer in the beauty of his surroundings. It takes the reader to a deeper place, an out of this world experience.



Fit Mind by Pat Divilly - Gill, January
Divilly, a podcaster and wellness coach, writes about how to deal with the internal voice that can be critical, sabotaging our attempts to achieve the things we want. His book includes an eight-week practical programme for mental and emotional fitness, which uses journaling, meditation and self-enquiry. It is about learning to slow down and silence our minds and is particularly relevant as we exit the stress of the past two years and find a positive way forward.



At a Zoom prayer meeting with people with disabilities on Sunday last, Matthew who is 26 and is in a wheelchair offered the following reflection which was printed on his parish website:

Reflection on The Beatitudes

To the poor, and those in solidarity with them – Remember God is with you.
Those who mourn and feel grief about the state of the world - Remember God is with you.
The non-violent, gentle and humble – Remember God is with you.
Those who hunger and thirst for the common good – Remember God is with you
The merciful and compassionate – Remember God is with you
Those characterized by sincerity, kindness and generosity – Remember God is with you.
Those who work for peace and reconciliation – Remember God is with you
Those who keep seeking justice – Remember God is with you
Those who stand for justice and truth as the prophets did, who refuse to be quiet even when slandered, misrepresented, threatened, imprisoned or harmed – Remember God is with you.

I am grateful for their vision, for their toiling on this Earth.


We are standing on the shoulders of the ones who came before us
