
Walk Don't Run

Efficiency is not God's highest goal for your life, neither is busyness, or how many things you can get done in one day, or speed, or even success.



Sr Anne Curran would like to thank all who sent her good wishes, cards and masses for her diamond jubilee.


'I had a wonderful celebration here with Lelia and then another when I was in Lourdes for the actual day. Mass will be offered for all your intentions. Many thanks.'
