TODAY APRIL 22 IS EARTH DAY 2024:






Earth Day is an annual celebration that honours the achievements of the environmental movement and raises awareness of the need to protect Earth's natural resources for future generations. It is observed on April 22 in the United States and on either April 22 or the day of the spring equinox in other parts of the world12. The first Earth Day was held on April 22, 1970, and it played a crucial role in educating people about the importance of environmental conservation. Approximately 20 million people across the United States participated in this

event, which helped garner support for significant legislation such as the Clean Air Act (updated in 1970) and the Endangered Species Act (1973) 1. Since then, Earth Day has grown into a global movement, with more than 200 million participants in over 140 countries during the 1990 global Earth Day organized by environmental activist Denis Hayes1. Today, the Earth Day Network (EDN) continues to promote environmental awareness and action year-round. Their mission is based on the belief that everyone, regardless of race, gender, income, or geography, has a moral right to a healthy and sustainable environment. The EDN focuses on education, public policy, and activism campaigns, making Earth Day one of the largest public, secular events worldwide1. So, on Earth Day, let's come together to protect our planet by taking actions like picking up litter, planting trees, and advocating for a healthier Earth!
