SIGNS of NEW LIFE from EAST TIMOR

Franzinha Fernandes is a 26-year-old Timorese woman who went to our community in Zumalai in search of a vocational answer.

After almost two years of living in community with the sisters and other young candidates, she has now arrived in Portugal for a period of pre-novitiate in our Institute. The Obra Social do Sagrado Coração de Maria in Braga will be her home. There, working with the sisters, families and children, she will continue her formation. We are very happy for her vocation and her presence among us.





Madalena da Silva is 22 years old and has one desire: to become a Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary. She met our sisters in the parish of Zumalai in East Timor. As a student at the parish's Catholic school, she met the sisters and the young people and adults of Mission Timor in 2019. She still remembers their names!

The years passed and the dream grew with them. One day she phoned the sisters: she wanted to have an experience in the community. Two years later, she arrived in Portugal for her pre-novitiate at the Obra Social do Sagrado Coração de Maria in Braga. We thank God for the joy of her vocation. We wish her a happy life.

9 JANUARY 2025 – JPIC MEETING IN ROME

The Institute's JPIC Coordinators worldwide are meeting in Rome. The group was welcomed by Sister Margaret Fielding and today also spoke with Sister Maamalifer, the Missionary Sister of Our Lady of Africa (MSOLA), Co-Executive Secretary of JPIC and Executive Secretary of UISG.

Together in Rome the Institute's JPIC coordinators visited the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) headquarters in the city.





The group is grateful to sister Veronica Brand for organizing the outing. Over the last few days in the city the JPIC/ONU NGO team reflected on how they can work with the other teams and groups of the Institute and prepared a statement and action plan to present in the 2025 General Chapter. The successful meeting was concluded with a beautiful worship service.

Established in 1945, FAO is a specialized UN agency leading international efforts to end hunger worldwide. It has 195 members — 194 nations plus the European Union — and works in 130 countries around the world. FAO's work contributes to 8 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. The tour included visits to several of the major meeting rooms, with art and artifacts that reflect member organizations' cultures and examples of planting strategies, such as hydroponics, which offers more sustainable growing solutions.



ASSEMBLIES

The **EAA Assembly** took place on January 10th and 11th. The Facilitator Sr Mary Maher suggested that the 2025 Chapter 'will be a new moment when our charism (which is God's gift) will reverberate in the new situations we will face in the Church and world. As she has done before, Mary brought us deep into our core values and raised our hopes that with God's grace we have all we need to face the future.''








GENERAL CHAPTER 2025
