#### GATHERING IN NODDFA - April - May




and into the future. What came through was a need and desire to deepen our understanding and practice of "walking together" and "Hope", with trust.


#### Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, Western American Area

In this month of May, dedicated to Mary, we are invited to contemplate the one who brought us Jesus and teaches us to follow Him. In the spirituality of the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, which is markedly Christocentric, Mary has great relevance. Her testimony of faith, zeal, courage and surrender inspires us to walk with Christ.

We are also grateful to Sister Teresa Nogueira for all her dedication and the work she is doing, and continue to be united so that all may have life.






#### 24 – 31 May LAUDATO SI WEEK (laudatosiweek.org)

For inspiration this week let's remember excerpts from Laudato Si'!



# We are united in prayer with our sisters, communities, collaborators and extended family in the United States on Memorial Day.





Pope Leo XIV, in his first papal address, echoed the risen Christ's greeting, "Peace be with you all," and emphasized the importance of prayer for peace and unity. He specifically mentioned the need for intercession and strength for those facing trials and hardships, urging all to be strong and joyful witnesses of the Gospel. He also called for dialogue and the pursuit of peace, particularly in areas affected by conflict.

"May the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary obtain for all of us the grace to be strong and joyful witnesses of the Gospel, even in the midst of trials, in order to always promote peace and harmony"

Pope Leo XIV said on Sunday at the conclusion of the weekly Regina Caeli.
