The Autumn Art of Letting Go: Lessons from Fall

As the days get shorter and the air turns cooler, there's something about autumn that makes us slow down and reflect. It's that time of year when nature gently reminds us to let go. The trees shed their leaves, making room for what's next, and maybe we should do the same. Autumn teaches us lessons that are very much a part of our own journeys.

The Beauty of Letting Go:

Think about the falling leaves. Each one has its own story, just like us. Those leaves were once buds in the spring, grew strong in the summer, and now they're falling away. They don't cling to the branches, they let go. And in doing so, they make space for new life to grow in the spring.

We can learn from that. Sometimes, we hold onto things that no longer serve us—old beliefs, past hurts, or even relationships that drain us. Letting go doesn't mean we've failed; it means we're making room for something better.



Autumn teaches us that change is part of life's natural flow. We don't need to have all the

answers right away. We just need to give ourselves permission to grow into the new versions of ourselves. This season is about accepting who we are becoming and trusting that, like the leaves, we're still beautiful even as we change.

A Moment for Reflection and Gratitude:

Pick one thing to let go of: It could be a habit, an old belief, or even a physical object. Letting go doesn't have to be huge—sometimes, small steps make the biggest difference.

Embrace change: Remind yourself daily that change is natural and part of life.

Practice gratitude: As you let go, reflect on what you're grateful for. Change can feel unsettling, but it's also a chance to grow.

The Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary became affiliated with the United Nations in 2006, raising the influence of the Institute's mission "that all may have life" to a global level.


We focus on education, participation, and advocacy, aiming to change unjust structures, assist girls, and promote sustainable development for all.

September 16 AREA OF MEXICO

Mexican Independence Day, September 16th, commemorates the historical moment when Mexico declared its freedom from Spain and its rights as a sovereign nation in 1811 under the banner of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The new Mexican government not only affirmed economic and social equality, but also abolished slavery, recognizing that freedom was a right to be enjoyed by all persons. However, it took eleven long years of war and the death of many to finally achieve independence in 1828 when Spain withdrew from Mexico and officially recognized its national autonomy.



Today, 16th September, we celebrate Mexico and its affirmation that no one is free until all are free - a country where all are responsible to ensure the rights of the other. May this day be one of rejoicing in the rich and diverse Mexican cultural heritage and in shaping a truly democratic government that protects and respects the dignity of every citizen, especially the most vulnerable and poor.
