

# Sister Teresa Capitão.


"I spent 25 years on mission in Mali, West Africa as a nurse. With those people, I learned to be poor and to be: "servant of the poor" .....

# October 12 Feast of Our Lady of Aparacida

It was 1717. Three fishermen were launching their nets in the Paraiba River.

The waters were empty, the fish were absent... until, between the mud and silence, something unexpected emerged: first the body, then the head of a small image of Our Lady of the Conception.

She wasn't big, she didn't make a noise... but it transformed everything.

The river that seemed dead began to bear fruit.

Hope is reborn. Faith has blossomed.

Since then, Our Lady Aparecida walks with the Brazilian people.

His small image reminds us that God reveals Himself in humility.

His appearance in the waters teaches us that faith is often born out of scarcity.

And your constant presence reminds us that a new beginning can always arise.

And to this day, Our Lady of the Appearance continues to appear:

In the silent moments, when no one notices.

In challenges, remembering that we do not walk alone.

Hope that sprouts even where it seemed impossible.

We learned from her to trust in God's timing, to wait even when everything seems empty and to believe that new life springs from murky waters.

Teach us, Mother, that small can be great, simple can be strong, and that faith transforms everything. Mary mother of Brazil, pray for us!
